Mom replied "No, it's not a magic. It is Artificial Intelligence. Al is when computers or machines are made to think and learn like humans".



THE GOODNESS OF HONEY



Honey is a sweet, sticky, yellowish-brown substance made by bees. The nectar present in flowers is collected by bees as they suck on the nectar of plants. The nectar in flowers is a mixture of water and sugars. Enzymes secreted by the bees, called inverses, convert sucrose (a double sugar) into disaccharide sugars, namely fructose and glucose.

The liquid yield is stored in the beehive, where much of the water content evaporates, leaving only about 18% water, resulting in the thick, sticky texture of honey. The hives are then stripped of their honey and packaged into bottles for our use.

BEWARE OF THOSE AIRBAGS

We have sometimes seen car accidents on television where cars collide with something, causing airbags to inflate. But what causes this inflation?

Airbags are packed and inflated by a chemical reaction involving sodium azide (NaN₃). Sodium azide is a stable molecule at room temperature. However, when heated, it decomposes, yielding nitrogen gas and sodium. It is believed that sodium azide, when decomposed, produces a significant volume of nitrogen gas, which is sufficient to inflate the airbag almost instantly.

The clever rabbit led the lion to a deep well and pointed inside. "The other lion is in there!"



Stem:


The stem of the Tulsi plant is slightly hairy and has a distinctive square shape, a characteristic feature of plants in the mint family (Lamiaceae).

1 cup caster sugar


1 cup oil




A Heartwarming Morning with Dad
